

Calvary, and the site of the Empty Tomb. When possible, we will celebrate Mass daily at the altars in these holy places, always ready to pray and present our petitions and those of our loved ones. Prince of Peace was born. There will also be opportunities to shop and dine among the local merchants, artisans, and eateries. Please join us on this incredible journey of faith. The Sacred Scriptures will come to life, and you will be changed.

#### Day 1 Sunday, February 26: Depart USA

Depart Newark Liberty International Airport for our pilgrimage to the Holy Land. Dinner (D), breakfast (B), and beverages will be served on board the flight.

#### Day 2 Monday, February 27: Arrive in Tel Aviv I Caesarea I Magdala

Arrive at Ben Gurion Tel Aviv Airport, go through Passport Control, claim our luggage, and meet a Peter's Way Tours tour manager upon our exit from Customs. Board our comfortable touring bus and soon we will be on your way to Caesarea by the Sea, the site of a flourishing early Christian community where the ruins of Turkish, Crusader, and Roman Civilizations are still visible. St. Paul was imprisoned here before being sent to Rome for trial. It was here also that St. Peter baptized the first Gentiles. Our visit includes the Theatre, the newly excavated Palace, the Hippodrome and the Harbor. Group stop for lunch (cost not included)

Continue to Magdala, the hometown of Mary Magdalene. Explore the archeological park with its first century synagogue and Magdala Stone, one of the most significant recent archaeological finds in the Holy Land. See the Duc In Altum spiritual center that houses the Women's Atrium, Boat chapel, Mosaic Chapels, and Encounter Chapel. Celebrate Mass at the boat chapel in Magdala. Check-in at our hotel.

Dinner and overnight at our hotel by the Sea of Galilee.

Day 3 Tuesday, February 28: Cana | Nazareth | Sepphoris | Mt. Carmel Breakfast at our hotel. After breakfast, begin our day with a visit to Cana, where Jesus performed His first miracle. The Wedding Church was built in the nineteenth century over ruins from Jesus' time. See the display of stone jars and reflect on the miracle of the changing of water into wine. Married couples will have an opportunity to renew their wedding vows. Proceed to Nazareth, where Jesus grew up and lived most of his life. See Mary's Well and imagine Jesus, as a boy, helping Mary carry water from the spring to their home. Our visits include the traditional synagogue that Jesus would have visited as a young boy and as an adult. The highlight of our time in Nazareth will be a visit to the magnificent Basilica of the Annunciation built over the house of Our Lady. Here, "The Word became flesh and dwelt amongst us." Contemplate the mystery of the incarnation and explore the beautiful basilica built in 1968. Celebrate Mass at the Upper Basilica of the Annunciation. Group stop for lunch (cost not included).

Continue to Sepphoris, a city that existed in Hellenistic times and was further developed by Herod's son Antipas after his father's death. According to tradition, Sepphoris was the home of Joachim and Anne, the parents of Mary, the mother of Jesus. It is possible that while living in Nazareth, Joseph may have trained Jesus in this town where his mother grew up. Explore this archeological site. Continue to Mount Carmel (Vineyard of God) on the Mediterranean coast. Here the triumph of Elijah over the pagan prophets of Baal took place (1 Kings 18). Visit Stella Maris, the largest monastery of the Carmelite order, dedicated to the prophet Elijah and Mary, Our Lady of Mount Carmel. It is easy to appreciate the natural beauty of this summit and realize the sanctity associated with it from ancient times to the present. Time will be given for prayer at the monastery. Return to the Sea of Galilee.

(B,D) Dinner and overnight at our hotel by the Sea of Galilee.

#### Day 4 Wednesday, March 1: Around the Sea of Galilee I Upper Galilee I Caesarea Philippi

Breakfast at our hotel. After breakfast, enjoy a boat ride on the Sea of Galilee. The Gospels come to life as we imagine when Jesus walked on the water (John 6:19-21), calmed a storm (Matt 8:23-26), and showed the disciples miraculous catches of fish (Luke 5:1-8; John 21:1-6). Arrive at the ancient city of Capernaum, where Jesus started His ministry. It was here that Jesus found Matthew and called him to discipleship. Here, the excellent condition of a second-century synagogue undoubtedly enclosed the sacred sanctuary in which Jesus taught and preached. Most Scripture scholars recognize the home of Peter's mother-in-law in the remains of a church near the shore. At Tabgha, Jesus challenged His disciples to feed a crowd of 5,000 in the Multiplication of Loaves and Fishes. Visit the Church of the Multiplication and the Church of the Primacy. Celebrate Mass at the Church of the Primacy. Here, after His resurrection, Jesus met with His disciples and told Peter to "feed my lambs; feed my sheep." Continue to the Mount of Beatitudes, where Jesus offered His "Sermon on the Mount." Group stop for lunch (cost not included).

Drive north to explore the upper regions of Israel to the foot of Mount Hermon, overlooking Syria and the Road to Damascus, where Jesus appeared to Paul. We will visit Caesarea Philippi and reflect in the place where Jesus looked at his disciples and said. "...But who do you say that I am?" (Matthew 16:15). We will reflect here on Peter's response to Jesus, "... You are the Messiah..." (Matthew 16:16).

Dinner and overnight at our hotel by the Sea of Galilee. (B,D)

#### Day 5 Thursday, March 2: Mount Tabor I Jordan Valley I Samaria-Sebastia I Jerusalem

Breakfast at our hotel followed by check-out. Today's journey is filled with variety and excitement. Leave the Sea of Galilee and drive to Mount Tabor. "...Lord, it is good for us to be here..." (Luke 9:33). At the foot of the mountain, we'll take a taxi to the top. The elevation provides an utterly commanding view of all of Galilee. It was here that Jesus revealed the wonderful power of presence in communion with saints of the past (Moses and Elijah). Thiscalso became immediate evidence of communion with His Father. Visit the site of the Transfiguration, with time to reflect on Christ's Humanity and Divinity. Celebrate Mass at the Church of the Transfiguration. Then, continue along the Jordan Valley. We will marvel at the desert that is blooming with beautiful flowers, fruits, and vegetables. Group stop for lunch (cost not included)

Continue on to Samaria-Sebastia, a land rich in Old Testament history. Sebastia was built by

Herod as the capital of the region and is where John the Baptist was buried after he was put to death. See the twin peaks of Mount Gerizim and Mount Ebal, known in the Old Testament as Mount Blessing and Mount Cursing. Today, Mount Gerizim is the home of the few remaining Samaritans. Stop at Jacob's Well, manually hewn out of solid rock and over 100 feet deep. It is most certainly the same well mentioned in the Gospel of John. The well is fed by flowing water, which is why ancients gave it the name of "living water." It is at this well that Jesus met the Samaritan woman and said to her, "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again, but whoever drinks the water I give him will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give him will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life. "Many pilgrims still like to drink from the well. Our journey continues "up to Jerusalem" through the beautiful Levonah valley, referred to in Judges as the Valley of the Dancers. We'll pass Shiloah, where the Ark of Covenant was kept. Continue to Jerusalem for hotel check-in.

Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Jerusalem.

### Day 6 Friday, March 3: Bethlehem I Shepherds' Field I Ein Karem I Holy Hour of Prayer in the Garden of Gethsemane

Breakfast at our hotel. Begin our day with a visit to the Shrine of St. Mariam Baouardy, known as St. Mariam of Jesus Crucified, the Lily of Palestine. She was one of the first Palestinian Saints canonized by Pope Francis. Continue to Bethlehem. Upon arrival, celebrate Mass at one of the Grotto chapels beneath the Basilica of the Nativity. The highlight of our time in Bethlehem will be a visit to the traditional birthplace of Jesus in the Basilica of the Nativity. Here, the Prince of Peace was born! Venerate the silver star that marks the place where the sublime mystery of the Incarnation was revealed in a manger. Group stop for lunch (price not included). After lunch, we'll visit Shepherds' Field where we will see caves that are typical of the stables of that time.

This afternoon we'll continue to Ein Karem, home of Elizabeth and Zachariah. See the Church of the Visitation, one of the most artistic in the Holy Land. Time will be given for quiet meditation on the meeting between these two mothers, Mary and Elizabeth. Verses from the Magnificat are engraved on the columns of the church, and on the wall opposite it are ceramic tablets bearing verses from the Magnificat in forty-two different languages. End our day with a visit to the Church of St. John the Baptist. Inside the church is a cave which is traditionally identified as the birthplace of John.

Dinner at our hotel. After dinner, we'll be transferred to the Garden of Gethsemane for a Holy Hour, Eucharistic Adoration, and Benediction.

Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Jerusalem

#### Day 7 Saturday, March 4: Dead Sea I Qumran I Jordan River I Jericho Breakfast at our hotel. After breakfast, we'll journey to the Judean Wilderness and the Jordan River to visit the traditional site of the baptism of Jesus by John the Baptist (Matthew: 3:13-17). It is also considered to be the place where the Israelites crossed the Jordan River and Elijah the Prophet ascended to heaven. Renew baptismal promises at the Jordan River (Mark 1:9-11). Continue to the Dead Sea and enjoy a panoramic view of Ein Gedi, the locale of the Song of Songs and where David hid from Saul's wrath. We will have the opportunity to float in the Dead Sea. We'll stop in Qumran where the hidden library of the Essenes, which contained the Dead Sea Scrolls, was found in 1947. Group stop in Jericho for lunch (price not included).

After lunch we'll explore Jericho, home of Joshua, Elijah's Spring, and the Mount of Temptation. Jesus performed many miracles here. Near the center of the city, a centuries-old sycamore tree still stands where the tax collector Zacchaeus, too short to see over the crowd, climbed its branches in order to see Jesus. Celebrate Mass at the Church of the Good Shepherd in Jericho. On our way back to Jerusalem we will stop in Bethany, where Martha, Mary, and Lazarus welcomed Jesus in their home. Visit the traditional tomb of Lazarus. Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Jerusalem. (BD)

Day 8 Sunday, March 5: Bethphage | Mount of Olives | Mount Zion | Temple Mount

Breakfast at our hotel. Begin our day with Mass at the Bethphage Church, which commemorates the place where Jesus of Nazareth entered Jerusalem riding a donkey. After Mass, we'll drive to the top of Mount of Olives. The summit offers a magnificent view of the Old City. This visit reminds us of Jesus' last hours in prayer and anguish as He faced His passion and death. Visit the Shrine of Pater Noster, and from here we'll begin our descent, on foot, down the mountain. We'll stop to visit the Church of Dominus Flevit (The Lord Wept). Continue walking on Jesus' Palm Sunday route along the Hosanna Road to the Garden of Gethsemane. Visit the Church of All Nations to pray at the "Rock of Agony," a section of bedrock identified as the place where Jesus prayed alone in the garden on the night of His arrest. Then we'll drive up Mount Zion to visit the house of the high priests and Church of St. Peter in Galicantu. Then, visit the Dormition Abbey and the Upper Room. Group stop for lunch (price not included). Walk to the area of the Temple Mount. Above the temple foundations, we will view the El Aksa Mosque and the Dome of the Rock. Visit the excavation of the Western Wall (Ophel Hill) and walk through the narrow alleyways and streets of Jerusalem, seeing the Pinnacle of the Temple (Gate of Hulda).

Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Jerusalem.

#### Day 9 Monday, March 6: Via Dolorosa I Emmaus I Return to the USA Early breakfast at our hotel. Then we'll drive to the Old City and enter through St. Stephen's Gate to the convent of the Sisters of Zion. We'll see the Lithostrotos in the Chapel of the Flagellation, where Jesus was condemned to death by crucifixion. Pray the Stations of the Cross along the Via Dolorosa to the Church of the Holy Sepulchre. Celebrate Mass at the Basilica of the Holy Sepulchre. After Mass, we'll have a guided visit of the basilica and the extraordinary opportunity to venerate the Empty Tomb! Continue to visit the Crusader Church of St. Anne and explore the Pool of Bethesda. Group stop for lunch (price not included).

Continue to one of the traditional Emmaus sites. We will recall the story in Luke's Gospel where Jesus appeared to His disciples on the road after the Resurrection.

Farewell dinner at the Ambassador Hotel. Following our farewell dinner, we'll be transferred to Tel Aviv Airport for our return flight to the USA. Overnight on our non-stop flight to the USA. (B,D)

Day 10 Tuesday, March 7: Arrive in the USA

Early morning, arrive in Newark Liberty International Airport, overflowing with life-changing memories from our pilgrimage.

#### Acceptance of these Terms & Conditions, with signature on enrollment form, is required for participation in this tour.

PAYMENT: All payments will be accepted in the form of check, money order, or debit/credit card. Peter's Way Tours (PWT) reserves the right to increase the package price or reduce services should there be an escalation in the Shekel valuation over the U.S. Dollar in excess of 3% from print date. If a final payment is not received by the balance deadline, PWT reserves the right to cancel your reservation. A \$50.00 late fee and possible increase in airfare may apply for late payments. Personal checks will not be accepted within 30 days of departure. If the bank returns a personal check, a \$50.00 processing fee will apply and subsequent payments must be made in the form of money order, certified bank check, or debit/credit card. Please consult the appropriate Consulate for current international travel requirements. Beginning in 2023, visitors to the European Union may require additional travel documents to enter the EU. After enrolling you will be sent information to apply online for ETIAS prior to travel (if required). Each traveler is solely responsible for ensuring that all required travel documents are complete and current. PWT will not be held responsible for a passenger's lack of current and valid entry documents (ie., passport, proof of vaccine, any required test results).

**AIR TRANSPORTATION:** This travel package includes round-trip economy class airfare from Newark. Flight itinerary and carrier may be subject to change. Estimated departure taxes & fuel surcharges are subject to increase prior to ticketing. If you purchase independent connecting flights, PWT will not be held responsible for the cost(s) if you cancel participation for any reason. It is important that you do not purchase airline tickets until the group has been confirmed for travel by PWT.

Single rooms are limited, subject to confirmation, may be smaller, and located apart from the room block. If a single room is confirmed, an additional charge of \$795.00 will apply. We cannot guarantee roommate requests but will make every effort to pair you with another traveler, if double occupancy is requested. If a single room must be assigned due to lack of a traveler to pair you with, a roommate's cancellation, incompatibility, or any other reason (at the last moment or while on tour), you will be charged the single supplement.

MEALS: Breakfast and dinner daily, including a farewell dinner prior to departure.

**GRATUITIES & SERVICE CHARGES:** Gratuities are not included in your tour package. Although voluntary, for good work we recommend \$10.00 per person per day for your tour manager and \$10.00 per person per day for your bus driver. Tips for your tour manager and bus driver are normally given as a group at the end of the tour. All service charges and local taxes as imposed by hotels are included in the program rate. Although service charges are included, it is customary to leave \$1.00 per person for the wait staff after each meal and \$1.00 per person per day for housekeeping.
